My first impression was the warm yellow and beige muted colors of the stone walls which matched elegantly with the Mission style building, brick entryway, and crushed gravel paths. The entry is as warm and inviting as the colors themselves. Above the main door hangs a boldly handsome 1,000 pound brass bell, which later I learned rings hourly and can be heard throughout the valley. Take a little stroll outside and you're greeted with a stately statue of St. Francis with his sheepdog companion by his side, surrounded by mature verdant olive trees providing cool and inviting shade.

When we entered through the doors, I was pleasantly surprised at how crowded it was. Yes, when it's crowded it's hard to find elbow room, but at the same time it's very inviting. The atmosphere was relaxed and lighthearted, and the guests were most definitely enjoying themselves. The tasting room is not very large and as such provides a cozy and comfortable experience, yet enough room to mingle around.
